

Spotlight on Members



Renee's Recipes

As we approach the Hamantashen holiday of Purim, which will occur on March 20, 2011, I am often asked if I have a good recipe for Hamantashen. Т have one that is terrific and I have used this recipe for the last and twenty years received it from a nursery school cookbook. I hope that you enjoy it as much as I do!

Ingredients:

1 cup butter 2 cups sugar 1t. vanilla 3 eggs 4 cups flour $\frac{1}{2}$ t. salt 1lb. filling

Instructions:

Beat butter, sugar and eggs with a mixer. Add flour and mix well. Refrigerate the dough until it is stiff. Roll dough to 1/4 inch and cut into circles with a glass. Fill and pinch into a triangle. 350 Bake at for approximately 20-30 minutes.

Dirt Pudding

1 lg. pkg. Oreo cookies 1/2 stick butter 1 (8 oz.) pkg. cream cheese 1 c. powdered sugar 3 1/2 c. milk 2 pkgs. instant French vanilla pudding 1 (12 oz.) carton Cool Whip Large bowl or 8 inch diameter (at top) plastic pot Optional – Gummy worms to decorate

Crush well (to fine crumbs) one whole package of Oreo cookies. Set aside.

together butter. Cream cream cheese and powdered sugar. In separate bowl, mix together milk and pudding mix, add to creamed mixture. Fold in Cool Whip. If using flower pot, plug hole in pot by placing a plastic container lid into bottom of pot. Layer cookies and pudding mix. End with cookies. Refrigerate. (Recipe should

be cut in 1/2 for smaller pot or bowl.) Decorate with gummy worms before serving.

Hungarian Cucumber Salad

Three steps to making Hungarian cucumber salad from Don Wittenberg.

Step One-

Make Salad Dressing 1/2 cup of vinegar (actually a bit more vinegar than water give a tangy to taste) 1/2 cup of water of 1 tablespoon sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt

Dash of freshly ground black pepper 6-10 thin slices of a sweet onion (using the potato grater side) Mix these ingredients together.

Step Two-

Take 3-4 nice size cucumbers. Use a potato grater (the side with 2-3 slits for slicing). Slice the cucumbers (thin slices) and place in a bowl with the cucumber dressing described in Step One

Preheat oven to 375. Line cookie sheet with foil and then parchment paper. Line bottom of cookie sheet with broken matzohs. Combine butter and brown sugar in a 3 gt. saucepan over medium heat, stirring constantly until mixture boils. Boil for 3 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and cover matzoh completely with mixture. Place cookie sheet in oven and lower heat to 350. Bake for 15 minutes, checking every few minutes for burning. While still warm, break into squares or other shapes. Chill in pan or freezer until set.



ANNUAL AWARDS DINNER



WHY B'NAI B'RITH?

Dear Fellow Educator,

THE EDUCATORS UNIT OF B'NAI B'RITH was formed in 1968-1969 in response to a **pervasive atmosphere of anti-Semitism** that was affecting educators throughout the school system. It became our mission to stop this from taking hold. **WE WERE SUCCESSFUL**. We adopted the position that we wanted an "even playing field" for Jews applying for positions in the system. We continue fighting for the issues that commenced our formation. Additionally, our programs appeal to a variety of interests. One of our unit's interests is to raise funds for B'nai B'rith Youth Services, as well as other related activities.

Within Philadelphia Council, **THE EDUCATORS UNIT HAS ALSO BEEN A LEADER.** We were one of the first groups to change to Unit Status (men and women in one group). Several members of our unit have served in leadership roles in Philadelphia Council. We are one of the largest B'nai B'rith groups within the council area. Our unit is respected within B'nai B'rith circles **due to the DIVERSITY OF OUR PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES.**

B'nai B'rith is the oldest and largest Jewish fraternal and service organization of its kind in the world. For many Jews, it has been the flame that has kept Judaism alive in hostile countries. B'nai B'rith activities include establishing orphan and old age homes and hospitals. You are probably familiar with the Hillel Foundation houses on many college campuses and AZA and BBG chapters for our youth. Additionally, B'nai B'rith has achieved a prominent position in the United Nations having the only "Observer Status" seat of its kind.

Following the anti-Semitic lynching of Leo Frank (ca 1913) in the South, B'nai B'rith formed the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) to fight against anti-Semitism and other forms of racism. ADL has been one of the main leaders in this fight. ADL exposed Norman Lincoln Rockwell to public scrutiny in the same way it exposed Farrakhan – by exposing his public statements to scrutiny.

IT HAS NEVER BEEN EASY BEING A JEW. The cost of not being united is even greater. We charge LESS than most B'nai B'rith groups, but even if this cost seems high on your budget, the yearly investment you make for yourself and others is very low. **WHY B'NAI B'RITH?** Because we need **the strength of organization** to help Jews – around the world, within our country, within our profession and especially, within the Philadelphia School District and suburban school districts.
